Is there anything else you would like to tell us about your coordinator?

He was not only supportive, he was helpful in that he made sure he was giving feedback that was relevant to what I was teaching and what I needed. He answered all my questions in a timely manner. In fact, I was typically shocked in how fast he responded to my questions and graded my material. He really helped me this semester and made my full internship go much more smoothly.

[my coordinator] did not provide ANY feedback whatsoever on any of the work that I submitted via Chalk & Wire. I was quite disappointed that I only received a score. I wish she included comments as she was grading my assignments.

The directions on the daily lesson plans and the Learning Project assignments were often initially unclear. Also, it would be greatly beneficial to do the in depth explanation of the Learning Project assignments at the seminar BEFORE when it was due. All of the students that I talked to were quite frustrated that the main explanation occurred on the day it was due and not the seminar before (so that we would have a month to work on it with a clear, thorough understanding). Besides the weakness of instruction clarity, I quite liked [my coordinator] as a person and as a peer. She provided lovely feedback during the observations and was always helpful with constructive criticism. She obviously cares for all her applicant's success and I recommend the furthering of her position with NSU.

I loved having [my coordinator] for my site coordinator. She was awesome to work with and made this semester one of my most memorable. She made me feel comfortable to ask questions and was quick to respond.

The only piece of feedback I would give, is to suggest that she explicitly outlines due dates to us.

For future students, I think this coordinator should not have interns who have a family, especially children. My kids come first and always will. I ran into some personal issues during my internship. I had to seek childcare that affected my internship. My CF and I worked something out so I could continue my internship, still be present daily, and my child had a place to go. When[my coordinator] submitted my final scores she took off for me being a parent. Teaching is the number one job for mothers. I do not think down grading me and making remarks about my children is professional. What shocked me the most is that to my face she was understanding and praised me for working something out so I can succeed, but then makes negative comments on my evaluations. I have NEVER had a professor at NSU who treated me like this. It made my whole internship stressful and at times made me want to quit. Family always comes first. Just because I am a mother does not make me a bad teacher!! College is hard enough. If NSU wants working successful adults, I do not think pushing them away is a good idea.
